Your feedback will influence decisions on:

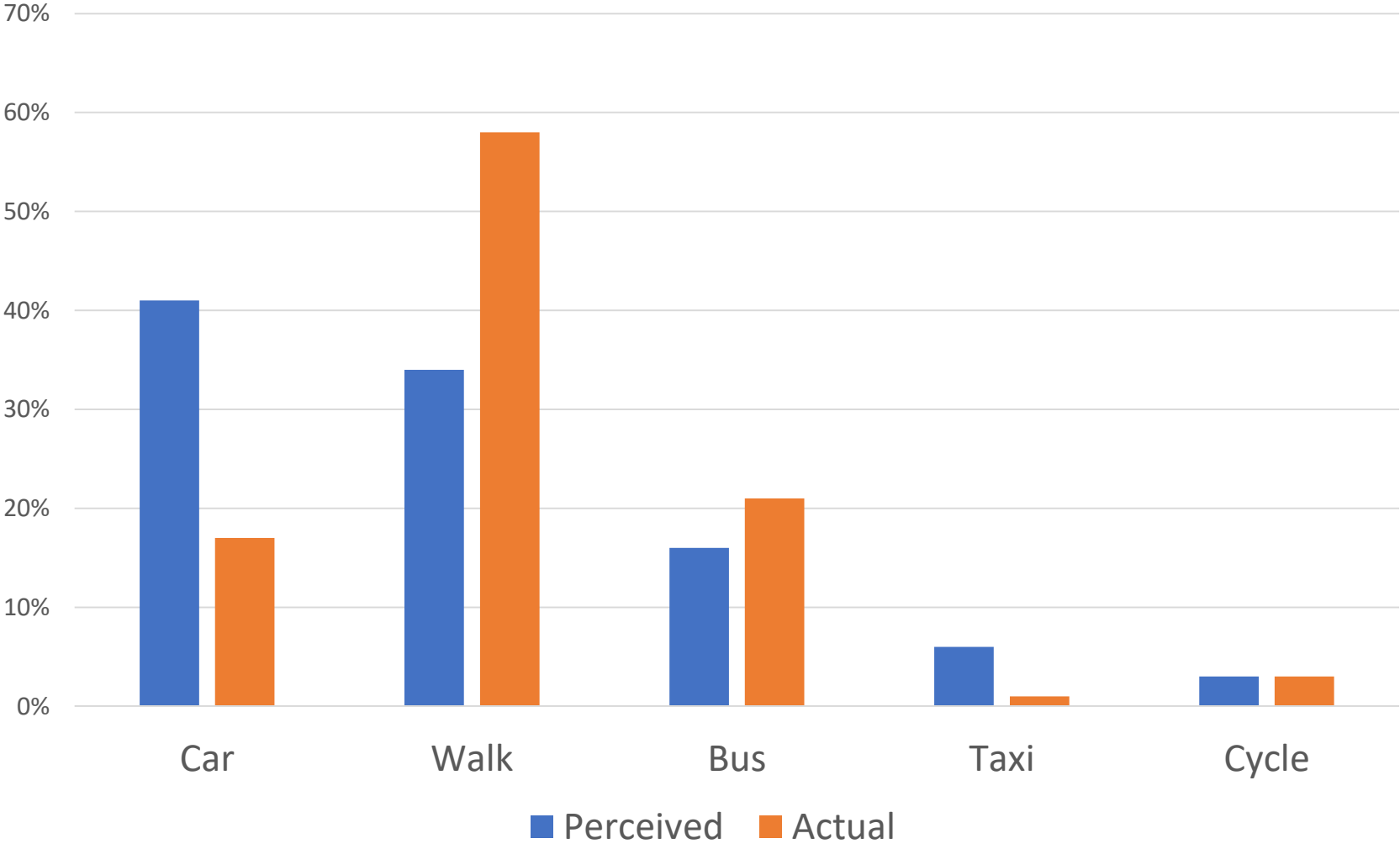
- Loading zone location

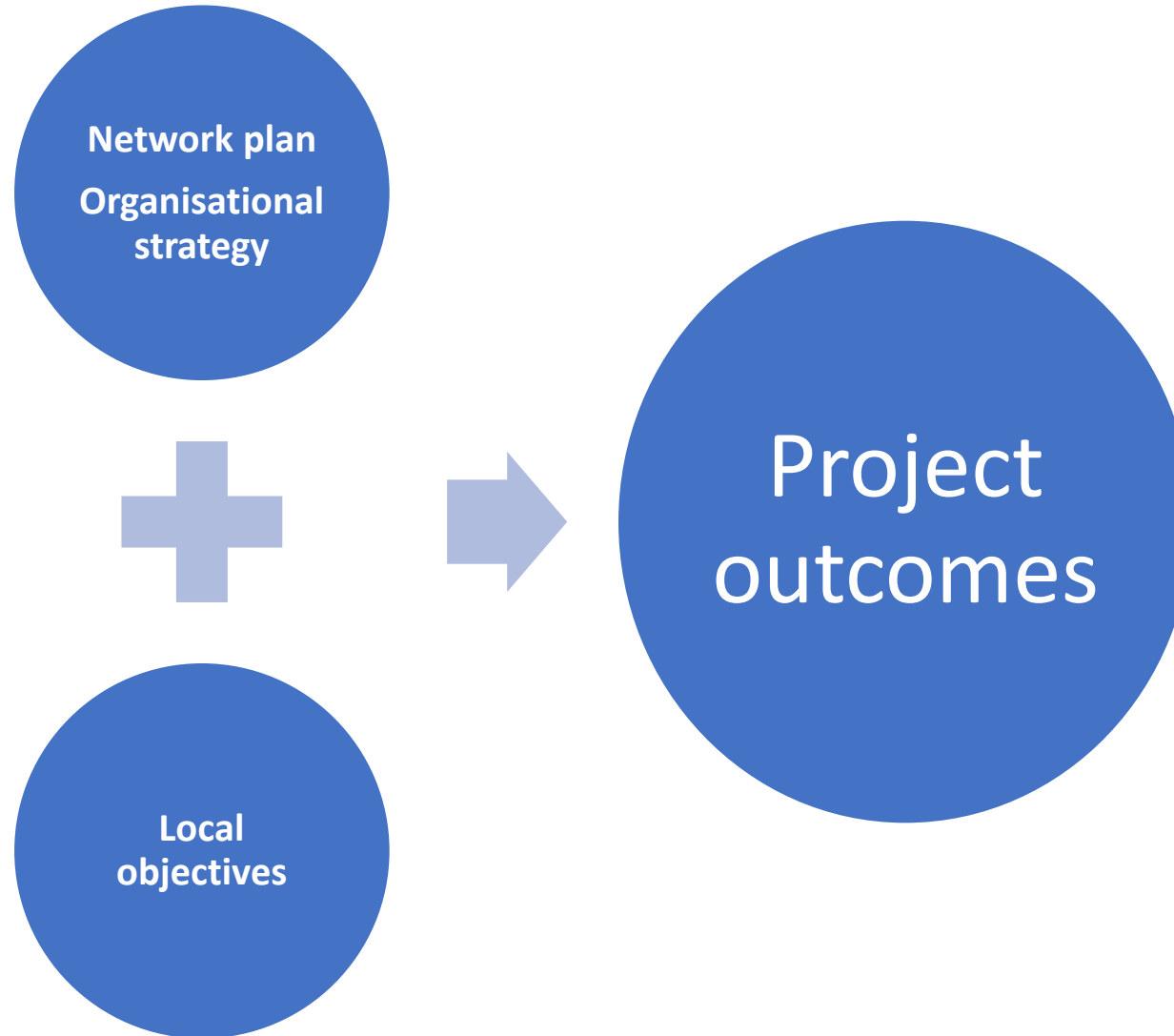
